FIRST SUMMIT GLS-2025

The first Global Library Summit (GLS-2025) aims to create a platform for international collaboration among libraries, enhancing access to information, advancing education, and preserving cultural heritage globally. The theme of the first summit is "Library Diplomacy: Uniting Nations through Library Cooperation," focusing on libraries' role in diplomacy and facilitating stronger ties among nations. Collaborative efforts such as shared digital libraries, interlibrary loans, and staff training will improve the quality and reach of library services, fostering cultural exchange and global development. GLS-2025 will showcase successful projects where libraries have driven global integration and peace-building, especially in less developed regions with limited access to information.

SOUTH ASIAN UNIVERSITY [SAU]

The summit will explore Library Diplomacy through initiatives such as the digitization of collections, collaborative projects, and cultural exchange programs, showcasing successful projects where libraries have served as catalysts for regional integration and peacebuilding. By addressing inadequate information and communication infrastructure globally that has historically deprived poorer countries of knowledge and learning opportunities, the summit seeks to enhance the role of global libraries in education, research, and cultural preservation. Through sharing best practices and developing joint strategies, Library Diplomacy at the GLS-2025 aspires to strengthen the bonds between countries, contributing to a more interconnected and peaceful world through the shared pursuit of knowledge.
